PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Fall 2006 Conference, **Let It All Fall Into Place**, will offer timely updates on key topics of interest to the infection control professional. Of note, there will be presentations highlighting the pending, revised 2006 Isolation Guidelines from CDC and statewide premiers showcasing two new resources – a toolkit for preventing emergence of antibiotic-resistant microbes in long term care and MSIC's 3rd Edition of its Elements for Infection Prevention & Control programs. Other essential presentations include an overview of new medical waste regulations, a unique session on different perspectives on control and prevention of TB, and tips on assuring a facility is doing all it can to prevent occupational exposure to bloodborne infectious diseases. New information on prevention of device-associated infection, key elements of surveillance of these unwanted complications, and a fascinating examination of convergence of human and animal health round out this exciting educational opportunity for the ICP.

OVERALL OBJECTIVES

3. Identify and implement effective performance improvement strategies to prevent hospital associated infections.
4. To name major proposed changes to the Medical Waste Regulatory Act.
5. Describe current research based oral care practices in preventing hospital acquired pneumonia.
6. Describe required elements of writing an exposure control plan.
7. Recite five major elements of a long term care infection prevention and control program.
8. Identify important aspects of bloodstream infection surveillance and new IV access pressure valves to help prevent infections.
9. To recite critical elements of CDC TB Guidelines.
10. To name zoonotic diseases of importance in the U.S. and Michigan.

Advance registration, \$185.00 (member) or \$225.00 (non member), must be mailed and ostmarked no later than **October 1, 2006**. Registrations received after that date or walk-ins at the conference will be classified as late registrations and must include an additional \$25.00 late registration fee. No confirmation notices will be sent upon receipt of the completed registration form. Total fee for walk-in registration is \$210.00 for members and \$250.00 for non-members.

A 50% refund will be given when cancellation occurs by October 1, 2006. No refunds will be given after that date.

MSIC is unable to extend credit for registration due to late processing of checks by affiliated institutions of members. Payment must be included with the registration form in this brochure.
